## Somerset Cider Tour (suggested itinerary)

Cider is synonymous with Somerset having arrived with the Normans in 1066. Records show sparkling cider was produced here in 1664 and at the end of the 19<sup>th</sup>C there were 24,000 acres of orchards.

Workers were paid in cider, plays written about it and now even the Irish make it!

### Day One:

Arrive at The Old Cider House (via one of the local cider farms?)

Sample a glass of cider from one of the Somerset producers

Plan the next day's visits

Enjoy a two course simple supper at The Old Cider House



### Day Three:

Breakfast and a stroll around the Village

Get back on the motorway via Taunton and another cider farm visit!

### Day Two:

Start the day with a hearty breakfast at The Old Cider House  
Set out on a day-long tour of a few of our local cider farms  
Perhaps visit Cheddar and pick up a pound of traditional cheese

If you get time, take a trip up Glastonbury Tor  
or pop into Clarks Shopping Retail Outlet at Street  
Return to base and pop to one of the pubs for dinner  
Perhaps another glass or two of the golden fermented apple juice?
